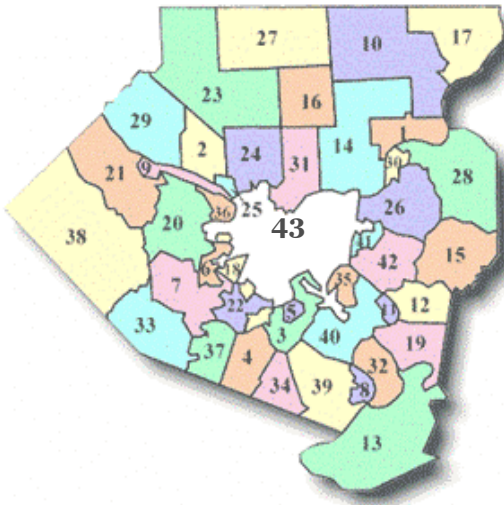




History
